

A small town express agent finds himself in big trouble when gangsters steal a cargo of valuable birds.

A small Southern town in 1961. Jack Lee is a simple, church-going man with a wife, a kid, and a job at the express company.

For years, a Kentucky racing pigeon club, managed by the urbane and mildly mysterious Milton De Lucia, has shipped birds to Jack's office at a train depot inHOMER Tennessee. The racing pigeons, some which are quite valuable, are released from this location to find their way home. Unbeknownst to Jack, club members place bets on the birds, making them a valuable commodity.

Across the street from the depot, stands the Dimple Hotel, headquarters for gospel music afficionado Cocky Hineman

who runs a gambling and prostitution organization. Once Cocky realizes the birds' value, he concocts a plan to kidnap them for ransom.

When the theft occurs, Jack Lee becomes the main suspect. He is caught in a vice between De Lucia with his hired guns and Cocky's small-town mafia.

The backdrop to the story is an off-center Southern town rich with unusual characters from both sides of the tracks.



DIRECTOR




Gabriel McCauley is an American film director,

Dr. John White is a writer who was born and raised in Columbia,



city power players.




ROSE

his closely-guarded past.



COCKY

Cocky is the half-German gospel music-loving head of the local mafia. He's the man who concocts the plan to steal the birds.



SHERIFF PEARL

Br. STONE

Brother Stone is the pastor of the African American church which overlooks the train depot. He is a witness to the robbery but is hesitant about coming forward because of racial relations in the town.
